Aryam Vázquez joined Wells Fargo's Global Risk Management team in 2008 as the Global Emerging Markets Economist, conducting in-depth economic, political and financial market analysis on the principal emerging market credits and analyzing, evaluating and interpreting country risk and sovereign credit conditions across the global emerging markets. Mr. Vázquez also supports Wells Fargo's FX team and the Trade Bank with daily economic commentary and analysis on the global emerging markets.

Mr. Vázquez began his career with Weston Financial Services in 1995, a small investment banking boutique with a Latin American focus, working as analyst under the guidance of Chief Economist Fernando Losada; formerly of the IMF. His assignments included close monitoring of economic and political developments across the Latin American economies. He later joined Dexia-Credit Locale de France, serving as a sovereign credit analyst responsible for number of global emerging market sovereigns.

In 2000, Mr. Vázquez joined IDEA Global, a leading global economic research and advisory firm, as Latin American Economist, covering a host of credits in the region, in support of trading execution across the local and external markets. This position would catapult him to Informa Global Markets in 2004, where he was charged with leading the firm's global emerging market research product, with particularly concentrations in the Latin American and EMEA economies, writing and advising on macroeconomic trends, political developments and trading ideas across the regional financial markets.

Mr. Vázquez was born in Havana, Cuba, and immigrated to the US in 1980. He graduated from Muhlenberg College in Allentown, PA, with a B.A. in international relations in 1995, and from the Columbia University School of International and Public Affairs with an M.A. in international affairs in 2007, concentrating in international political economy and security studies.
